DISABILITY EMPLOYMENT

This issue of The Arc de' Triomph is spotlighting all things employment for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) and other disabilities. IDDs include autism spectrum disorders, cerebral palsy, Down Syndrome, fetal alcohol spectrum disorders, and intellectual disabilities. The unemployment rate for people with IDDs is about 2x higher than for people without disabilities. Most people with IDDs are willing and able to work and are an unseen labor resource in today's tight job market.

Findings indicate that barriers to employment for people with IDDs include discrimination, workplace attitudes, misunderstandings about the cost of accommodations, effects on benefits, and transportation. Findings also identify a host of benefits to companies who hire people with IDDs: lower turnover rate, and higher rates of reliability, retention, loyalty, and punctuality, as well as an increased degree of favorable public opinion toward the company and greater enrichment from workplace diversity (Forbes Business Council 12/03/21).

With a major funding initiative from the AWS Foundation, the Arc of Wabash County is addressing obstacles to competitive, integrated employment (CIE) for people with IDDs. The Arc Wabash County is transforming employment programs and services to promote, nurture, and support CIE for people with IDDs.

The Arc Wabash County is creating and supporting employment with competitive pay for people with IDDs. We are expanding our secure document destruction business and hiring people with IDDs to work in the business. We have expanded our Community Employment staff who assist people with IDDs in finding competitive pay employment in the local community.

Studies show higher productivity and retention rates for workers.

The Arc's Sunrise Employment Services is always seeking new community partnerships for employment. The Arc will work with the business to ensure a good fit and provide 24 months of on the job Supported Employment Services.

COFFEE HOUSE OPENS NEW DOORS

The Arc of Wabash County has purchased a coffee house located in North Manchester. The former, Kenapocomocha Coffee Shop, will remain a coffee house empowering and employing individuals with disabilities. This purchase will allow us to not only offer employment but job skills training.

Located in the North Manchester historic district, the coffee house will be the first business in Wabash County run by individuals with disabilities. There will be an onsite manager and career coach. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics the unemployment rate for individuals with special needs is over 80% and employment opportunities are limited after the age of 22. We are aiming to break all the limitations and are confident that everyone is capable of being a functional part of society.

LIFE AFTER HIGH SCHOOL

Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS) is a service offered to local students with disabilities who are eligible or potentially eligible for Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) services. This is a great opportunity to ensure students have access to meaningful career planning in order to help with the seamless movement from high school to employment or post-secondary training.

The Arc's Sunrise Employment Services is currently in all Wabash County schools and will be expanding in to Grant and Miami counties. The Arc works with the students on job exploration, work based learning, and instruction in self advocacy as part of the Pre-Ets program.

Meet Jacob, a Manchester High School student, interning with MPS Egg this Summer. Jacob not only works weekly with our Pre-Ets team, but he is getting hands on job experience. Jacob will walk the rows to move the birds, help with feeding, discard abandoned eggs and work on special projects.

The Arc would love to share more with you about our Pre-Ets program if you have someone that you think would benefit from our services. There is a lot more to both Pre-Ets and VR that The Arc can help you navigate.

SHREDZ OF HOPE

Our mobile shredding and cardboard business, Shredz of Hope, provides employment and competitive pay for individuals with disabilities. Shredz of Hope currently employs six individuals with disabilities. You've probably seen our mobile shred truck around the community. But did you know we soon be iSigma NAID certified? This tells you that we are secure, following all government requirements for secure documents, and completing audits.



THE BIGGEST WINNER

In an effort to promote health and wellness throughout our organization, we started a Health Challenge here at The Arc. We had 32 staff and individuals we support join this challenge, resulting in over 165 pounds lost in just 12 weeks!

Each participant weighed in weekly. The winners were based off of highest percentage of body weight lost. The top 3 winners from the staff challenge and the top three winners from the individuals served challenge were awarded \$250 (1st place), \$200 (2nd place) and \$150 (3rd place). We had a great time working together and encouraging each other to be healthier!
